Abstract: A decade of terrestrial and underwater archaeological research has revealed much about Basque and Inuit activities in the northern Gulf of St. Lawrence. Hare Harbor was first visited by late 16^{th} century Basque whalers. In the late 17^{th} century the site became a cod-fishing and charcoal-production facility operated jointly by Basques and Inuit. In addition to documenting post-1600 Basque activities in the Gulf, Hare Harbor is the first site to demonstrate Inuit economic collaboration with Europeans.
