During July special talks are being arranged and will be given by


Spanish doctors and trained Spanish women in welfare work.

## NEWS BULLETIN

June, 1946.

A very successful inaugural meeting of the above society was held in the Town Hall, Hammersmith, when His Worship the Mayor, (Alderman F. Brader, J.P.) presided to an interested audience.

The Mayor said it gave him great pleasure to be in the Chair at such an enthusiastic gathering and knew that if and when such training was completed, how beneficial it would be to many people in Spain where now so much was being denied them under the Franco regime, and he would give every assistance he could to further such a splendid, and useful project.

Mrs. Gwendolyn Adams de Puertas spoke of the aims of the Society and its usofulness in the homes and the future of Spain. That the programme of the Short Course Lectures was augmented by visits to various Health Centres, and all women were invited to join the Society, whether in London or not, as other activities would be ar-

ranged later in which they could all help.

Mr. Lizaso said it gave him great pleasure to represent the Spanish Republican Government on such an occasion and remembering what Hammersmith had done for the Basque children at Nazareth House, and it was his honour to bear to His Worship the Mayor a letter from the Prime Minister, The Right Honourable José Giral, thanking the Mayor for his kindly cooperation and wishing the Society every

Dr. Day, (Acting Medical Officer of Health for Hammersmith) gave success. a short summary of explanation of the lectures and statistics of various diseases common to all countries and the progress of medecine in war, and that everything would be done to help the Society that

the candidates get athorough and interesting training.

Alderman E.E. Woods, J.P., told of the different ways that groups of women which included the Women's Voluntary Service, had helped this country during the war and had been the salvation of many thousands of people when they fed and clothed them after being rendered homeless by enemy action. In Hammersmith they had had Mrs. Adams to run hostels for such people and her work by the different mayors, which included himself, was well known and appreciated, and he knew that it was her experience of the war in Spain that later helped them.
