The Oxford Committee is a voluntary and non-sectarian organisation, and includes members of various religious denominations, also University and business men and women.

The Committee was formed in 1942 and has sent (through the generous support of many thousands of individual persons) food, medicines and clothing for war victims in eight countries.

In recent times more than two million garments have been dispatched.

The registered object of the Committee is "The relief of suffering arising as a result of war or of other causes in any part of the world".

AN ALLE, DIE GUTEN WILLENS SIND.

Das Oxford Komitee ist eine freiwillige und unabhaengige Organisation, die durch Glieder der verschiedenen religioesen Bekenntnisse, Mitglieder der Universitaet, Geschaeftsleute und Frauen gebildet wurde.

Seit 1942, dem Gruendungs jahr, wurden durch die grosszuegige Hilfe vieler tausender Menschen Lebensmittel, medizinische Praeparate und Kleidungsstuecke an die unter der Not des Krieges leidenden Menschen in acht Laender geschickt.

Allein mehr als zwei Millionen Kleidungsstuecke wurden verteilt.

Hauptaufgabe des Komitee ist es "der Not zu steuern, die als eine Folge des Krieges und anderer Verwicklungen aufgetreten ist".

A LA BONNE VOLONTE INTERNATIONALE

Le Comité d'Oxford est une organisation volontaire et non-secterrienne, formé par des étudiants, hommes d'affaires et de différentes religions.

Ce comité fut formé en 1942 et a envoyé (grace à des milliers d'âmes généreuses) nourriture, médicaments et vêtements pour victimes de guerre de huit pays.

Jusqu'au jour plus de 2 millions de vêtements ont été envoyés.

L'Objet du Comité est "Aide dans la souffrance causé par la guerre ou autre cause dans le monde".

BRITISH OFFICERS have appealed urgently to us to keep up the supply of clothing and footwear for children and other refugees (more than 11 millions in Western Germany alone). Many, having lost their breadwinner, are destitute and living in air-raid shelters, or in other miserably overcrowded conditions.

Other supplies are urgently needed for Greece (where hundreds of villages were burnt down in the recent fighting); also for Austria and Poland.

Some of the Arab refugees in the Middle East, whom we are also helping, are living in caves and are badly in need of certain clothing, blankets, etc.

WILL YOU please help to make it possible for us to send increased supplies? Even so the total supplies to millions of war victims in Europe will now be very much smaller owing to the cessation of help to them from many official sources.
