## ANNOUNCING THE 15TH EDITION

We are proud to announce the availability of the 15th issue of *Yearbook of International Trade Statistics*, a publication of ever increasing demand among industrialists, importers and exporters, insurance managers and brokers. According to the data shown in this issue, all regions of the world contributed to the increase of exports between 1963 and 1964, from \$153,000 million to \$172,000 million. The developed areas increased their exports by 14%, the developing areas 9%. The exports of the Middle East showed the largest percentage increase 17%, followed by North America 15%, Western Europe 13%, and the African Continent, also 13%.

In the developed areas, the share of Western Europe in world exports increased from 39% in 1958 to 41% in 1964; the improvement was mainly due to an increase in exports of the countries of the European Common Market (Belgium, Federal Republic of Germany, France, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands) which rose from 22% of world exports in 1958 to 25% in 1964. The exports of the Free Trade Area (Austria, Denmark, Norway, Portugal, Sweden, Switzerland and the United Kingdom) showed a slight decrease, from 15% of world exports in 1958 to 14% in 1964.

Imports of all regions of the world increased in 1964. Largest import increases were shown by Australia, New Zealand and South Africa, 20% in all; the European Free Trade Area 14%; Latin America, the European Common Market and Canada 13% each; the Soviet Union 11%; and the United States 10%.

An analysis of imports versus exports shows that the deficit in the balance of trade of the developed areas of the world continued to widen the gap (\$7,400 million in 1964 against \$5,400 million in 1962, while the deficit of the developing areas was reduced from \$2,300 million in 1962 to \$500 million in 1964).

This year, the *Yearbook* provides detailed information on the external trade of 144 countries and territories covering about 98% of world trade for which data are available. In the case of 123 countries, accounting for more than 86% of world trade, the analysis conforms to an internationally agreed commodity classification, United Nations *Standard International Trade Classification*.
