Dear Sir,

In reply to your lettr of the 10th instant, and after making the appropriate inquiries, I beg to inform you that Victoriano Martinez Vanacloy, who lived in Valencia, Calle Colon 62, has no relatives in this town. But as your letter said that a sister of the said Victoriano Martinez lived in Requeña we have tried to find her, and we have learned that this man's mother is living, called Dolores Vanacloy Martinez, but not in Requena but in Aldea de Hortunas, some 30 kilometres from Requena. She says she wrote several letters to her son and only received an answer to one of them. The poor woman is very anxious to have news of her son, as it is three years since she has heard from him.
