Dear Sir,

I have read your letter in the Spectator, 22<sup>nd</sup> Sept. 1961.  
The news takes some time to reach us here.  
I had the privilege of working in the International Medical  
Services in Spain 1936-1939, and finally saw the disastrous  
conditions in the concentration camps in France.  
I am distressed to think of Republican Spain being tortured for their  
beliefs after twenty years of fascist rule.  
I have written a book on my experiences in Spain which may  
some day help to combat the vicious fascist propaganda which  
even now slanders the Republican Government which worked  
so hard to better the lot of the Spanish people. A German member  
of the International Brigade, now an Australian citizen,  
has had some work published. We are small voices but may  
eventually be heard in the cause of justice.  
I sympathise deeply with you in your distress regarding  
your fellow countrymen.
